School Events

We have a very busy couple of weeks coming up at Jerramungup DHS— Cross Country, Netball Carnival, School Photos, Speech and Writing Competition, Gairdner Carnival and assemblies.

Our high school students will be attending several excursions and incursions bought to them by the Career Taster Program at Southern Regional Tafe. The aim of these sessions is to provide our students with a small snippet of an insight of different careers they may be able to choose. Some of our office staff are also off to attend a 2-day training course for the new system of Compass. This new system will be in place from the beginning of next term, and it will come with an app which will hopefully make it easier to communicate things such as absences, permissions etc between school and home. More information will come out about this once the training has been completed.

Report Writing

Teachers are all busy writing reports, and I would like to take this opportunity to encourage students to do their best in any assessments that may be coming up. Reports will be emailed home on Monday 23rd June. As always, I encourage staff to make sure the reports don't contain any surprises for parents – excellent communication the key between school and home.

A link is being sent home for parents to indicate 2 preferred times to attend interviews with their child's teacher. These interviews will only be a 10-minute chat with your child's classroom teacher to discuss their progress so far this year. Mrs Zahra and I will try to line up families with each other as best we can. There will also be a comment box to indicate if you are unable to make the Tuesday and we will endeavour to slot you in at another time suitable for both you and your child's teacher.

Not all parents can be involved in school as much as they'd like, but you can still let your child know that school is important to your family. Talking about school with your child, being warm and friendly at school events, and being positive about the school and its staff sends the message that you value education and are interested in what's happening for your child at school, while highlighting the importance of academic and social progress.

Attendance

Winter has arrived and the rain has been very welcome however it sometimes makes it harder when it is wet and cold to get students to school on time. Punctuality is critical to supporting your child / children's education. It is one area where parents can have a direct impact on their children's education. Consistent attendance at school has direct correlation on student achievement. Our teachers are noticing that attendance has dropped off in the last few weeks and while we understand there has been a particularly nasty bug going around it is important that particularly our high school students are following up with teachers to chat about things they may have missed.

Principal's Address – Mrs Robb

The following statistics make interesting reading.

Missing school adds up:

- if a child misses an average of five days a term (years 1 to 10), they miss out on approximately one year of school
- if a child misses one day a week of school (from years 1 to 10), they will miss almost two years of school
- if a child misses 1.5 days a week of school (from years 1 to 10), they will miss almost three years of school
- if a child misses two days a week of school (from years 1 to 10), they will miss almost four years of school
- if a child misses three days a week of school (from years 1 to 10), they will miss almost six years of school
- if a child misses five weeks a term (years 1 to 10), they miss almost five years of school.

Makes for very scary reading!!

Reading In Everyday Life

Beginning Readers

Talk about language you and your children come across in everyday experiences

- 1. **Talk It Up** ... your child's vocabulary is essential to them understanding what they read. Help them to build their vocabulary by talking to them about interesting words and encourage them to ask you about words they don't understand.
- 2. **Signs and Symbols** ... Point out signs and symbols you see and what they mean. It will reinforce the idea that symbols, such as the letters in words, have meaning.
- 3. **Play 'I Spy'** ... This is a great way to connect letters and sounds and language with the words they represent.
- 4. **Words all Around** ... Read out words you see when shopping or out and about. When children become familiar with some words, ask them to read them for you.
- 5. **Read Aloud** ... Set aside time every day to read (and re-read) favourite books. Hearing them helps familiarise children with language.

Year 1 and 2 Assembly

On Thursday 22nd May, our energetic Year 1/2 class took to the stage for their first assembly performance. The students proudly demonstrated one of their favourite parts of the school day: getting their 'wiggles' out with "The Wiggle Dance" by Danny Go. With big smiles and even bigger hips, they showed the school how this fun and active routine helps them start each morning feeling focused, happy, and ready to learn. Some students enthusiastically and some students reluctantly joined in for the second round along with the parent audience. It was a great reminder of the power of music and movement to bring energy and positivity into the classroom.

Well done to our fabulous Year 1/2 students for sharing their morning routine in such a fun and enthusiastic way.
